Carole Taljeh and Sue would like the Davis Autism Approach to be more noticeable. Carole was at the Au-Some Conference at the Pacific Autism Family Centre in Vancouver in April, and they now have a report from us to submit to their Board, with the intention of referrals coming Carole's way.

Speaking of Outreach- Sue has enjoyed delivering her information sessions as always. She was thrilled to get a call from a young man with whom she worked when he was 9. He is now at business school and wants to create a new website for us! SO, we are very excited to say that very shortly we will have a fantastic new website to take us forward.

We hope to keep building our Community with a subsidised Family Summer Camp weekend, June 1-3 at Camp Elphinstone. This will provide both fun and the opportunity to meet like-minded families. Nadine, who loves researching, has discovered the pleasures of homeschooling which is something we discussed at our Strategic Planning meeting in September. We have no shortage of ideas, just need a framework to bring them into being. We are all looking forward to yet another successful year, bringing us closer to our goals. So thank you again to everyone who has helped us, and to those who will help us in 2018.
